## REQUIRED MATERIALS

- 15-20 IMAGES of recent (within a year) work
- DIGITAL IMAGE SPECS: Your images should be JPGs, RGB, 72 ppi, and no larger than 2,000 px on the longest side. The images should be named using our "lastname\_firstame\_01.jpg" format, where the numbers (01, 02, 03, etc...) correspond directly to your IMAGE SCRIPT. If you want to submit video files, we ask that the videos be no longer than 3 minutes. The video file types we accept are .MOV and .MP4
- An IMAGE SCRIPT, which should include title, medium, dimension, and date of each image that corresponds with your file names (lastname\_firstname\_image\_script.pdf)
- CV/Resume (lastname\_firstname\_CV.pdf)
- Artist Statement/Work Description (lastname\_firstname\_statment.pdf)
- Letter of Intent: Please describe the artistic or project goals you would like to further during a residency at Flower City Arts Center (lastname\_firstname\_intent.pdf)
- All of the above files shoud be submitted in a single .zip file labeled with your first and last name
- 2 letters of recommendation (to be emailed/mailed directly to the program area)

Flower City Arts Center reserves the right not to review applications that are formatted improperly.

# **RESIDENCY FRAMEWORK**

- Residents will create a cohesive body of work in a culminating public presentation (exhibit, public presentation, book launch, event, etc) at the end of residency period
- Residents have the option to participate in center-wide classes on a space available basis (responsible for materials fee, class fee is waived)
- Artists are responsible for their own housing
- Basic studio equipment and tools are provided
- Residents receive access to all of the facilities and technical expertise available through our staff and teaching faculty
- Paid teaching opportunities available at the rate of \$22/teaching hour

### **DESCRIPTIONS OF RESIDENCY PROGRAMS**

Flower City Arts Center is seeking committed, community-minded artists to be part of our dynamic studio residency program. Applicants are juried by a staff panel and emphasis is put on the quality of work and the candidates' expressed desire to be part of a community studio practice.

#### **CERAMICS**

Residents receive private studio space with full access to facilities, a firing stipend, materials at cost, and an exhibit in the Firehouse Gallery. There is no preference for functional over sculptural. *There are 2 positions available.* 

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Residents contribute through the support of studio and gallery operations, and by participation in special events
- Desire to teach required (teaching experience a plus)
- 1 year time commitment
- 10 hours a week of studio or teaching responsibilities
- BFA or MFA Ceramic degree is preferred though not required

#### PHOTOGRAPHY & DIGITAL ARTS

Residents receive full access to the Community Darkroom, Silver Den, Digital Art Studio, and Lighting Studio. Length of residency and time of year to be mutually agreed upon.

- Access to facilities and equipment
- Community Darkroom includes basic B&W chemistry, any additional materials artist is responsible for supplying
- Residency can be process and/or project oriented

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Community engagement with production of new work
- 2 weeks up to 1 year time commitment
- 10 hours a week of studio or teaching responsibilities
- Desire to teach encouraged (teaching experience a plus)
- Between September and March: assist with our youth programming for 3 hours a week on Wednesday or Thursday afternoons.

#### **PRINTMAKING & BOOK ARTS**

Residents receive full access to the Letterpress Studio, Papermaking Studio, Printmaking Studio, and Screen Printing Studio. Length of residency and time of year to be mutually agreed upon.

- Access to facilities and equipment
- Studios include equipment and tools any consumable materials artist is solely responsible for supplying
- Residency can be process and/or project oriented

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Community engagement with production of new work
- 1 month to 12 month time commitment
- 10 hours a week of studio or teaching responsibilities
